WOMEN ARE VOTING

KLAMATH FALLS women today are exercising the right of franchise, and a notable feature is that those who in the past have early predicted the way an election was to go are today silent. Those interested in the result have made up their minds that only the completion of the count will give anything like an accurate estimate of the consensus of opinion on the subject.

Another noticeable feature of today's voting has been the change in not only the condition of the voting places, but actually in the demeanor of the election officials. There is an absence of tobacco smoke, and every place where voting is in progress might easily be mistaken for an office of a business concern, instead of a club room for men only, as in the past.

TEN-HOUR LAW IN EFFECT NOW

EIGHT HOUR LAW KILLED IN THE SENATE, AND HOUSE MEASURE IS FINALLY ADOPTED BY THE SOLONS

After May 25 employees of sawmills cannot work over sixty hours in any one week without receiving overtime of price and a half for extra hours.

An eight hour law was introduced in the senate during the last legislative session, but it was killed before it reached the house. The ten hour law originated in the house, and was carried by a substantial majority. W. O. Smith, Klamath's representative voted for this measure.

UNPOETIC NAME WILL STICK UNTIL SAN FRANCISCO PEOPLE THEMSELVES GET TO CALLING IT YERBA BUENA ISLAND

WASHINGTON, D. C., March 10.—Goat Island it is, and Goat Island it will remain until the people of the region around San Francisco bay shall make it Yerba Buena Island again by their own daily use of the Spanish name.

That's the official opinion of Henry Gannett, chairman of the United States geographic board, delivered in a letter to Representative Kahn, after many club women had written him an appeal to banish the homely back-lot appellation.

Gannett explains that some of these letters have been "very abusive"—trying, in short, to make of the geographer the same thing he calls the bit of land between San Francisco and Oakland. He refuses to be made a goat.

"We might legislate until doomsday," he says, "and it would do no good until Californians began to use the name Yerba Buena. Fifteen years ago I looked into the question, and found just one name for that island used there, and that was Goat."
