## MORE PHEASANTS FOR KLAMATH CO.

**TWELVE "CHINAMEN" SHIPPED FROM STATE FARM TO JUDGE GRIFFITH—WILL BE LIBERATED SOON**

Twelve Mongolian pheasants arrived in Klamath Falls Sunday, consigned to Judge J. B. Griffith. After the birds become acclimated they will be liberated.

The pheasants were shipped here from the Simpson game farm at Corvallis at the direction of State Game Warden Finley, as efforts are now being made to stock Klamath county with this splendid game bird.

During the past few winters pheasants have been shipped here, and all have survived, showing that the weather is not too severe. Most of the birds, however, have fallen victims of pot hunters, but the farmers and sportsmen are keeping a close watch to see that the last few birds brought here are not killed.

Sixty-four pheasants have been liberated since last fall, and they have shown up regularly at ranch houses for food during the winter.
