FOR MUNICIPAL PLANT

The suggestion of Supervising Engineer Hopson of the reclamation service that Klamath Falls take advantage of the opportunity offered by the government to acquire valuable water power rights on Link River and establish a municipal power and lighting plant brings before the public one of the most important problems in the history of the city, and one on which action should be taken at once.

The California-Oregon Power company paid almost half a million dollars for a power site on Link River, and since that time has succeeded in making a profitable income from the Klamath Falls public by charging high rates.

Klamath Falls is offered an opportunity to provide citizens with light and power at a rate lower than prevails in any other city in the West, or the city may charge a slightly higher rate and assist materially in the lowering of taxes, or in the carrying on of needed improvement work without imposing an additional burden on the property owners.

Moorhead, Minnesota, offers an example of the advantage of a city owning and operating a power plant. In spite of the fact that there electricity is generated from coal, the lighting rate is lower than in most places, and each year the city makes a handsome income from the operation of the plant.

Klamath Falls, with cheap power, should do even better.

MARCHO CASE BEFORE COURT

SPECIAL VENUE OF 20 CALLED BY JUDGE BENSON — JURY WILL REPORT TOMORROW AT 10 O'CLOCK A. M.

But a single man was retained to sit on the jury after the examination of the panel to try the case of the state against W. H. Marcho this morning. Judge Benson issued a call for a special venire of twenty to report to court tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock.

Marcho is charged with the larceny of a steer. The testimony in the criminal case is expected to be similar to the testimony introduced in the civil action against Marcho, and which was decided late Wednesday afternoon. Most of the venire examined this morning had served on the jury in the civil case.

Fred Mills is attorney for Marcho and John Irwin is prosecuting for the state.

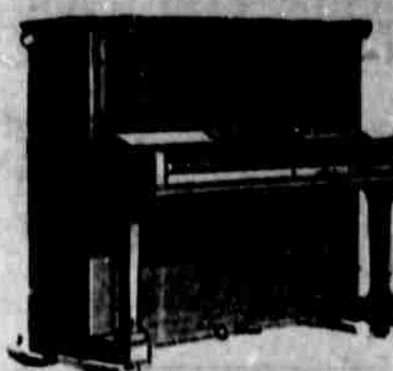
