

SACRAMENTO, March 24 .-- A framatic story of the effects of executions on the prisoners of San Quentin was told here before the senate judiclary committee by Edward H. Morrell, a member of the Sontag-Evans gang of bandits, who served fourteen years in the penitentiary.

"The man, who was my cellmate. worked in the shoe shop directly under the death chamber," said Morrell. He used to hear the thump of the men dropping through the trap just overhead. For days afterward he ppeared to be in a date. The thing grew on him until one day, with a wild look in his eyes, he shook me roughly and told me I'd better get a ew cell mate quickly.


