## WAS FORMER KLAMATHITE

IRA C. JOHNSON, PREVIOUS TO HIS DEMISE IN ILLINOIS, RESIDED IN THIS COUNTY FOR MANY YEARS

The following obituary is taken from the Clinton (Illinois) Register: "Again has one of the nation's heroes fallen from the line of comrades that is so swiftly marching toward the tomb. Today they are here; tomorrow they are among those who have passed from life to death and loved ones are deep in sorrow. Only a few days ago Ira C. Johnson was about the streets. He was taken sick, and almost from the first there seemed little hope of his recovery, and after three weeks of suffering the summons came. He had been afflicted with heart trouble, which was made the more serious by a large goiter. His age was 67 years, 4 months and 25 days, being born in Champaign county, Ohio, November 19, 1845.

"In 1861, when but a boy of 16, and against the wishes of his parents, Mr. Johnson answered his country's call to arms by enlisting in the Sixty-eighth Illinois Infantry for the 100 days service. At the expiration of his term of enlistment he went to Ohio and joined the Sixty-sixth regiment of that state as a bugler, and remained with it as such for about three years. Mrs. Johnson has the sash he wore, and the bugle and canteen used by him, and prizes them very highly. But a short time before his death he received his commission and badge as aide-de-camp on the staff of the commander in chief of the G. A. R.

"About 1876 Mr. Johnson went west, where he successfully engaged in various occupations in Kansas, Minnesota and Colorado. Then going further west he took up claims near Klamath Falls, Ore., which he owned at the time of his death, and subsequently located at Salem. He was united in marriage to Miss Emma Smith, October 26, 1895, in Portland, though their homes were both in Salem. Twelve years ago, leaving their business interests in the West they came to DeWitt county, and occupied the old homestead south of Clinton, to care for Mr. Johnson's parents, which they did well and faithfully."

## WOMAN'S VOTE IS UP AGAIN

HIG RALLY IS BEING HELD IN WASHINGTON, CONCURRENT WITH THE OPENING OF CONGRESSIONAL SESSION

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 7.—Concurrently with the opening of congress, a great war began here today. It was the war of womanhood for the right to vote, and suffragists by the hundred were on hand to launch the campaign. The first guns fired were at the mail of President Wilson, which was so heavy that the letter carriers complained of overwork, and telegrams fairly flooded the executive offices. Each of these communications asked, demanded, suggested or pleaded that the question of suffrage be taken up by congress.

Before noon, nearly 1,000 women were assembled in a downtown theater, where a "rally" preceded the first personal work. After this, an informal parade to the Capitol was planned, with Boy Scouts in line to help keep order. Then began the real campaign. Senators and congressmen found themselves button-holed at every turn, and no member escaped. Each was besought to advocate suffrage by voice and vote. This plan, the leaders declared, would be kept up regardless of rebuffs. Miss Alice Paul is in charge of the campaign, but national leaders such as Dr. Anna Shaw, Charlotte Perkins Gilman and others, will be here at intervals to assist her.
