"Ineligible to citizenship" make a violation of treaties.

This was the only announcement following today's meeting of the cabinet, when Bryan's telegrams were considered.

John Bassett Moore, counsellor to the state department, and an authority on international law, occupied Bryan's seat as acting secretary of state. Moore and Wilson conferred for three hours regarding the situation, and the telegrams to Bryan were answered.

The contents of Wilson's answers to Bryan are withheld. It is understood that they answered every objection raised by the Californians.

SACRAMENTO, April 29.—After laying the cornerstone of the new Y. M. C. A. building, Secretary of State Bryan received a long cipher message from President Wilson.

It is believed here that the telegrams are an answer to Bryan's reports on the California situation.

The messages, it is reported, contain further instructions for Bryan. It is possible that another executive session may be held late this afternoon.
