N. JERSEY LAW MAKERS CONVE

JURY REFORM BILL ONE OF THE
PRINCIPAL MEASURES TO BE
CONSIDERED AT SPECIAL SES-
SION OF LEGISLATURE

TRENTON, N. J., May 6.—The special session of the New Jersey legislature, called by Governor Fielder to consider a jury reform bill, a constitutional convention bill and an act making mandatory small boards of freeholders convened today.

By an agreement reached between democratic and republican leaders, these are the only measures which will be taken up during the special session, which, therefore, is expected to be a short one.

More than passing interest centers in the legislation that will or will not be put through at the special session which met today, because President Wilson's active interest in the proposed jury reform bill.

For four days prior to the convening of the session President Wilson stumped the state in the jury reform measure's interest.

GEORGE IS KING 3 YEARS NOW

THIRD ANNIVERSARY OF HIS AC-
CESSION TO THE THRONE IS
BEING CELEBRATED BY HIS
SUBJECTS

LONDON, May 6.—The third anniversary of the accession of King George to the British throne was celebrated today by the firing of military salutes in St. James' Park, London.

Similar artillery salutes also were fired at Windsor and at all the large military and naval stations.

Warships along the coast "dressed ship" with bunting and flags were on all government buildings and many business houses.

King George and Queen Mary attended a memorial service for the late King Edward at the royal chapel at Frogmore, and the king afterwards placed a wreath on his father's grave. The king is 48 years old. He succeeded his father on May 6, 1910, and was crowned in Westminster Abbey June 23, 1911. He married Queen Mary in 1922, and has five sons and one daughter.

CHEAP LOTS

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Mighty Pitching Hand of Walter Johnson, Which Fans Believe to Lead Senators to Championship



WASHINGTON, May 6.—If the Senators, led by "Old Fox" Clark Griffith, win the American League pennant in the season of 1918 it will be due chiefly to the mighty pitching hand and arm of Walter Johnson, "the big Swede." Washington fans believe that Johnson is the greatest of baseball pitchers. Many throughout the country think so, too. Not until last season, when Griffith lifted

the club from a tail-ender up to be a contender for the pennant could it really be seen how great he was. Last season he was the third in the record of American League pitchers, with a percentage of .727.

But he did more than that. He pitched forty-eight games, far above the average number engaged in by big league pitchers in these days. Had he been with a great club all the years he has been with the losing Senators he would probably be hailed as the

greatest of pitchers by hundreds of thousands.

Milan, the great outfielder; Ainsmith, catcher, and McBride, shortstop, are also going to help mightily in bringing the Senators to the front. Milan batted .306 last year, though in the first seven games of this season he had only .172. Both Ainsmith and McBride batted .226 last year. But in the first seven games this year the one has batted .318 and the other .308.
