American Made Choo-Choos and Cars Are Hauling People and Freight in Many Foreign Lands

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 12.—The sales of American locomotives and railway cars in foreign countries have been increasing steadily for the past five years, but the popularity of such rolling stock is confined almost entirely to Canada and Latin America. In a monograph on the foreign markets for railway supplies and equipment about to be issued by the bureau of foreign and domestic commerce, it is shown that of \$5,200,000 worth of railway cars sold to foreign countries during the first ten months of the fiscal year 1913, over \$5,100,000 worth were sold to Canada and the Latin republics.

types of rolling stock have consequently been evolved. American locomotives have been tried in a few of these countries, but it is claimed that they have not proved satisfactory. In countries where railroads are a more recent development the capital has to a large extent been furnished by a few of the more important European countries, with the natural result that orders for equipment are given to the countries furnishing the capital. Where the roads are owned by the government, the home manufacturers are invariably favored in buying the equipment.
