

Keokuk Dam Dedicated With Great Ceremony;

KEOKUK, Iowa, Aug. 26.—With both shores of the Mississippi River at this point banked with spectators, and the river dotted with boats containing thousands of others, the Keokuk dam, the greatest water power project in the world, and one of the largest engineering feats of modern times, was officially dedicated today.

The governors of Iowa, Missouri and Illinois, noted engineers from various parts of the world, dignitaries from Washington and municipal officials from a score of cities and towns near here, took part in the ceremonies. A delegation of Eastern governors on their way to the Governors' Conference at Colorado Springs, stopped off today to witness the dedication ceremonies.

The great Keokuk dam will furnish 200,000 horsepower in light and power to scores of cities from Dubuque to St. Louis. It stretches across the Father of Waters between Keokuk and Hamilton, Illinois, and cost approximately \$25,000,000.

The huge wall of cement, stone and brick is fifty-three feet high and forty-two feet at its widest point. Twenty-five hundred men worked three years to complete the dam, in the construction of which 650,000 barrels of cement alone were used.

It is 4,649 feet in length, and will make Cooper Lake a body of water sixty-five miles long, from one end to the other, and a half mile wide and fifty feet deep.

LIGHTER BEEF AND PORK SHIPMENTS

SHORTAGE MAKES A LITTLE HIGHER PRICE IN THE PORTLAND MARKET—RECAPS OF SHEEP GOOD

PORTLAND, Aug. 26.—The receipts of cattle have been lighter than usual for the week, with bulk of offerings going readily at slightly higher prices. Both steers and cows have moved at an advance of about 15c. Choice steers sold as high as \$8.35, ranging down to 8c, according to quality. Best cows and heifers easily brought 7c, and some good class stuff went from \$6.50 to \$6.75. Prime veal calves went at from \$8.75 to \$9.00.

Hog arrivals have been very light. Prices advanced 25c for the mid-week offerings and one load sold on Friday at \$9.15 and one at \$9.05. Only two loads were available at the week end.

Liberal receipts of sheep, with the prices holding a little better on good stuff. Most of the lambs received at the week end sold at \$5.25 "off carcass." Prime yearling wethers brought \$4 to \$4.25. Prime ewes sold at from \$3.50 to \$3.85.

Evelyn Thaw in Fear of Husband



NEW YORK, Aug. 26.—Mrs. Evelyn Thaw, the young wife of Harry K. Thaw, over whom he killed Stanford White, is one of the three persons in fear of their lives now that he has escaped from Matteawan asylum, where he was committed as criminally insane after his trial for murder. The others are Dr. Austin Flint, the alienist, who decided that the man was insane, and so testified, with the result that Thaw was sent to Matteawan, and has been kept there despite his efforts to get out through habeas corpus proceedings, and William T. Jerome, former district attorney of New York county, who has bitterly fought every effort of Thaw's to get out of the asylum.

There is a commonly accepted report that Thaw has threatened to kill all three—his wife, because he has been angered at her conduct during his confinement in the asylum. What adds to the anxiety of the three is the fact that, having been declared insane, no punishment other than further confinement in the asylum could come to Thaw, even if he were to kill one or all of them.

Mrs. Thaw has recently gone on the stage, having made her debut as a vaudeville dancer, with Jack Clifford, in Paris, some months ago. For two weeks she has been playing at Hammerstein's Victoria in New York city, and in her appearances on the stage she has shown nervousness since her insane husband has been at large.

GENOA, Aug. 26.—Accompanied by the two carabinieri who have not left his side since he was taken from the New Jersey prison on August 14, Porter Charlton arrived here today on board the d' Italia, to stand trial for the murder of his wife. Fears that he might attempt suicide during the voyage, rather than face the Italian courts, were entirely ungrounded, according to the carabinieri.
