REACHES PRISON IN TORN LINGERE

First Fall Meeting of Those Seeking on the Stage Are Put to Rout by Women, Using Fists and Umbrolles as Their Weapons.

LONDON, Oct. 6 .- Miss Kenney, militant surage leader, was arrested again today by the police, after a hard fought battle between the "bobbles" and the militants.

Miss Kenney struggled so hard that her clothing was torn from her body. She reached Holloway prison clad only in sadly torn underwear.

The arrest occurred at the Suffrage Pavillion, where the first of the fall weekly meetings was called.

Chief Inspector O'Brien of Scotland Yards and twenty policemen were concealed in the wings of the pavillion stage. As Miss Kenney started her address, they rushed on the stage and bore her away, screaming, kicking and biting.

A hundred women using umbrelles and their fists set upon the minions of the law, and while they did not succeed in rescuing Miss Ker they administered a sound drubbing to the police.
