Indians Gather to Discuss Helping Race

DENVER, Oct. 7.—To advance the interests of the American Indians and to make good citizens of the thousands on the government reservations is the purpose of the convention of the Society of American Indians, which opened here today, and will continue through Saturday. Persons who expected to see bearded, befeathered red men among the delegates were disappointed. The 500 attending Indians were really better dressed as a whole than were the governors who recently attended the National Governors' conference here. Men prominent in the profession and all walks of life were among the visitors. The delegates include Roy Sherman Condit, H. D., an Apache of Fairbault, Minn., president of the society; Arthur C. Parker, Prof. J. N. H. Hewitt, a Tuscarora Indian of the Smithsonian Institution at Washington; Louis C. Riddick, an Okonite Indian; Henry B. Cloud, H. A. Moore, Carlos Montezuma, M. A. M. D., an Apache; John Oakum, M. D., Cherokee; and a score of others. One of the chief topics to be discussed will be that of representation of Indians at the proposed grand council and passage of the American Indian to be held at Denver in 1915, to discuss better education for the Indian and the gathering of data for a detailed history of the American Indian.

Grand Jury Takes Up Disappearance of Tot

NEWCASTLE, Ind., Oct. 7.—Determined to solve the mystery of the disappearance of little Catherine Winters last March, the grand jury today began a searching inquiry into the case, under special instructions from Judge Jackson.
The mystery has been as baffling as the famous Charley Ross and Dorothy Arnold disappearances. Catherine Winters, on her way home from school, disappeared on the afternoon of March 29, as if the earth had suddenly opened and swallowed her.
A nation-wide search by county, state and federal detectives and the deaths of the best private agencies of the country, failed absolutely to unearth the slightest clue to the child's whereabouts or the manner of her death—if that were her fate.
However, County Prosecutor Evans recently unearthed what he believes are important clues, which make him believe the child is still living.
The child's pictures have been almost as widely printed as those of Dorothy Arnold.

In the name of the State of Oregon: You and each of you are hereby commanded and required to appear and answer the complaint of the plaintiff filed herein against you, on or before the 11th day of November, 1913, that being the date fixed in which you shall appear and answer, by order of Honorable Henry L. Benson, Judge of the circuit court of the State of Oregon, for Klamath county, and if you fail so to appear and answer, plaintiff will apply to said circuit court of the State of Oregon, for Klamath county, for the particular relief prayed for in said complaint, to-wit: To quiet title in plaintiff, in and to lots one and two (1 and 2), section two (2), township thirty-nine (39) south, range thirteen (13) east, W. M., Klamath county, State of Oregon, and to bar any right, title, interest or estate that you, either of you, or each, any or all of you may have in and to said premises, and for a decree of said court that plaintiff be, and is the owner in fee of said premises.
