CITY TO RETAIN ITS WATER SITE

DESPITE RECOMMENDATION OF MATTHEWS, IT IS HELD BETTER TO PROTECT THE PRESENT FILINGS

The city's filings on a number of streams in the vicinity of Aspen Lake are too valuable to be relinquished, according to members of the council. Accordingly at last night's meeting of the council, they rejected the project of Councilman Matthews to abandon these filings.

In a long communication Matthews declared that the cost of gathering water from the various streams tied on would be prohibitive. He recommended instead the development on property along Link River.

Other members of the council, though were of the opinion that the filings were too valuable to relinquish. A letter from the state engineer in regard to the amount of time given the city for developing the filings indicated that there was no immediate rush necessary, so the city engineer was instructed to prepare for measuring the water available.

CONSIDERING BUILDING HIGHWAYS

Jackson county was the first to take advantage of the new law, and already has voted bonds for the construction of the Pacific highway through the county, and connecting the principal towns. An election has been called in Crook county for the same purpose, and other counties are gathering the necessary data to determine the amount of bonds needed to build permanent roads.

ath River Route. And Siskiyou county must be persuaded to build a large portion of this road since it will pass for miles through Siskiyou territory.

Unless we get this road we will be sidetracked just as we were for years before the Southern Pacific Company built into the Klamath basin.

The idea that Klamath County has a chance to bring the California highway to some point near Dorris instead of Coles or Hill should be forgotten as soon as possible since there is absolutely no chance thereof.

The only thing to do is to induce Siskiyou county to meet us at the line and afford us an outlet that way.

Some consideration has been given this route already by the County Court and the supervisors of Siskiyou county with the result that a \$20,000 outfit is now at work on the Azer road and is producing good results.

We are not in a position to dictate relative thereto but rather should use our best diplomacy to bring about a closer union and to show an important community of interest between Klamath and Siskiyou counties. We feel this can be accomplished and hope that you will realize to the full the importance of this suggestion.

With the accomplishment of this connection with California the success of the Central Oregon route is assured and will be as popular as the other. Without it there will be little use.

In time perhaps a branch line will pass through Madoc County, thus affording us an outlet via Merrill, Dry Lake, Lookout and the Pitt River, but for the present the California Commission will busy itself with the construction of the Siskiyou route to Coles or Hill. This being the case we had better meet the situation as it is and stake our efforts toward securing one good satisfactory outlet to this great highway.
