SAYS THERE IS A GRAVE DANGER

ENTOMOLOGIST SAYS KLAMATH AND LAKE COUNTY TIMBER IS IN NEED OF CAREFUL ATTENTION

Your paper erred somewhat Saturday, in stating that the timber of Klamath and Lake county is in no danger from the pine beetle at this time," said Field Agent W. E. Glendinning of the bureau of entomology, department of agriculture, who has been making investigations here for some time.

"On the contrary, there is a grave danger. The timber is at present not in a bad condition, but scattered through the forests are small tracts of infested trees, and it is very easy for the pest to expand from these, unless action is taken right away to eradicate the beetle.

"The present situation in this section could be likened unto that of Northern California a few years ago, when a malignant outbreak of forest insects occurred. This resulted in the destruction of millions of feet of timber, necessitating a large cash outlay in control measures."

San Francisco Busy Arranging Portola

(Herald Special Service)
SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 13.—The program for the Portola festival of October 25 is practically complete, according to announcement made today, and it is the biggest program of its kind ever compiled for four days San Francisco is going to be a town center of joy.

The events include many in which the entire West will participate, for the whole Coast, and the mid-Pacific, too, is going to help celebrate the fiftieth anniversary of the discovery of the Pacific ocean by Vasco Nunez de Balboa.

The big holiday will start with a bang, and will keep going fast way till the last horn is stilled Saturday night, October 25th. Governor Hiram Johnson will give the word, when he delivers a message for the Queen of the Portola in the bay regatta, who, running and swimming, will carry these greetings to the coast. They start from Sacramento at 7 p. m., October 21st.

The parades will set new standards. The military parade will be as absorbing as any review that ever swept before king or ruler. In the second daylight parade civic, commercial, industrial and other organizations from all over the Coast, will participate, and the floats will be the most varied and beautiful ever seen in the West. The great night electric pageant is one of the most ambitious schemes ever hatched out. A score of the big, best floats, outlined in electric lights, and manned by costumed crews, will sweep through the crowds, on the 30-foot street car tracks, firing colorful bombs over the heads of the on-lookers.

The floats will show the evolution of the grandnought from the period of the trirams, there being in the production of many historic ships. There more will be pageants, the leaves, receptions, banquets, and in occasion of the workshops in the harbor.

The musical program is elaborate, covering the entire festival. Through will gather in the open air, under an unimpeded sky, for this phase of the holiday. Never was city earthed as San Francisco will be for the forty-two miles of streets being turned into bowlers.

By day as well as by night there will be fireworks, on a larger scale than the Pacific Coast has yet seen, and in addition there will be the wonderful illuminations of the city and the harbor. Electric-outlined way will flash wartime signals as they lie in the reflection of castled hills crowned with fire.
