PROSECUTING ATTORNEY COMPLETES DEAL FOR PURCHASE OF MAYHEU PROPERTY, BACK OF EWAUNA HOUSE

Trout Planted

T. J. Craig, chief deputy fish and game warden, and assistants arrived in Medford Friday afternoon in the fish car "Rainbow." He distributed 150 cans of rainbow trout in this county this trip, and has 41 cans of eastern brook trout that will be taken to Butte Falls to put in Butte Creek. Mr. Craig says there are 500 small fish in each can. The fish were hatched at the Bonneville hatchery, and Mr. Craig says they have put out between five and six million this year.

May Go "Wee"

Holding that the duty of the county court is merely administrative in such matters, Judge Hamilton has ruled that a writ of mandamus be issued to the county court to order an election in the town of Sutherlin on Tuesday, November 4, under the local option law. This writ was asked by Mrs. M. E. French, of Sutherlin, by her attorney, B. L. Eddy. The county court, on October 6, ruled that such election could not be held on that date for the reason that the town of Sutherlin held no regular election at that time, and the referendum election in the entire state on that date was a special election. A decision of the supreme court seeming to uphold

that view was quoted by the county court in making this order. Roseburg Review.

New Scenic Point

It is not generally known that Medford has within one hour's travel one of the greatest scenic wonders that can be looked upon in the state of Oregon. For the purpose of ascertaining the possibility of an automobile road to the summit of Roxy Ann, the writer, with a party of Medfordites, made the trip, and found that an automobile road is feasible. The summit can now be reached by wagon and horse within 300 yards, but with the expenditure of \$500 a good road to the summit can be built without difficulty, and traveled by auto during the summer months.—Medford Mail-Tribune.
