A NEEDED AMENDMENT

WE ARE publishing today a communication from Hon. Jonathan Bourne Jr., containing a copy of a proposed law which he suggests as a remedy for the present abuses of the referendum law.

The proposed law makes it illegal to secure paid distributors of petitions for the referendum, recall or direct primary. At the present time, by the use of money, it is possible for anyone to defeat the will of the people by holding up good legislation. We have an instance at the present time in the referendum on the university appropriations. Through the use of paid solicitors the state university is deprived for some time of this much needed appropriation, and the state is compelled to expend thousands of dollars in holding an election.

It is safe to say that if it had been left to the voluntary action of the voters of the state that there would have been no referendum, and no necessity for an election. Those who believe in the necessity of the proposed law should write Jonathan Bourne and offer their assistance in getting it on the ballot at the next election.

Bourne's New Bill Hits Latest Election Evil

Elimination of any payments or promises of favors to persons circulating petitions under the initiative, referendum, direct primary or recall acts, is the purpose of a bill just devised by Hon. Jonathan Bourne Jr., former United States senator.

In an open letter to the people of the state, Mr. Bourne outlines his measure as follows:

"Believing, as I do, that the Oregon system is the best legal medium thus far evolved for the protection of both personal and property rights, and that the initiative and referendum are the mainspring of the whole system, and that no increase in the percentage of petitioners for the initiative or referendum is necessary, or a majority vote requirement advisable, yet I am firmly convinced of the advisability and necessity of a legal prohibition of paid circulation of petitions.

"The sole purpose of the Oregon system of popular government is to secure an effective expression of the will of the people. So far as the initiative, referendum, direct primary and recall do secure such expression, they are invaluable powers in government. To the extent that they fall in this regard, they are defective, and remedial measures should be adopted.

"The beginning of action under these reserved powers must be a petition which is designed to represent a certain amount of public sentiment in favor of a specific movement. Experience has shown, however, that men favoring certain measures or candidates employ others to circulate petitions and secure signatures thereon, paying a specified sum for each signature secured, with the result that the petitions do not truly represent public sentiment. To the extent that a petition does not represent the desire of the people, it is a means of deception. Experience has also shown that the practice of employing paid circulators not only results in securing signatures out of proportion to public sentiment, but encourages unscrupulous persons to forge signatures. This evil has been so pronounced, not only in Oregon, but in Ohio, that remedial measures are urgently needed.

"We must preserve unimpaired the right of petition. But preservation of the right of petition does not require continuance of the practice of employing paid circulators any more than preservation of the right to vote requires continuance of the former practice of paying men to go to the polls. All that is necessary is free opportunity for preparing, circulating and filing petitions.

"I believe that if real need exists for a proposed law, or if there be general desire for the candidacy of any person, that need or desire will be recognized by a sufficient number of persons who will voluntarily circulate petitions. If public sentiment is not strong enough to secure voluntary petitions, no harm will be done by de-

ITALIANS MOURN HOLIDAY LOSSES

GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES HERE-TOFORE HAD SEVENTY-SIX HOLIDAYS DURING THE YEAR—LIST IS PRUNED TO SEVEN

ROME, Oct. 27.—The 100,000 employees of Italy's bureaucratic system of government administration are audibly lamenting the cutting down of their holiday schedule. Up to the present time, besides Sundays and a month's vacation in summer, the employees have had 79 national and religious holidays scattered through the year. A decree in effect today cuts these latter down to seven, consisting of New Year, Epiphany, Assumption, Easter, September 29 (Italy's Fourth of July), All Saints' Day and Christmas.
