OUR WEEKLY SERMON

"An Unknown Quantity"

"I have left me seven thousand
in Israel all the knees which have not
bowed unto Baal"—1 Kings, 19:18
1 Kings, 19:18.

The unknown quantity surrounds
us on every hand as abundant as the
air we breathe. It is difficult for the
farmer that sows his grain by hand
to know the portion of seed on all
parts of the land.

The prospector may estimate, but
not know for a certainty the ex-
act amount of ore in a mountain.

Likewise, it is impossible to know
the number of people who vote as
they pray, for few knees are cal-
loused from kneeling in prayer con-
cerning matters of government.

The people spoken of in our text
deserve little praise for their faith-
fulness, and no credit for their atti-
tude. This class, wherever found,

causes the chariot wheels of progress
to drag heavily. Elijah the Prophet,
had in a wonderful test before idola-
trous proven that Jehovah was the
only true God. Queen Jezebel threat-
ened his life, and because he feels
that he alone is standing for the right
we find him fleeing for his life. Hear
his defense: "I only am left, and
they seek my life to take it away."

Here is a discouraged preacher that
after the strain on Mr. Carmel need-
ed a word of cheer, but none came.
The Lord now tells him to return to
the field of victory and complete his
work, as there are seven thousand
people who have not worshiped Baal.

We wonder why this great host did
not offer a volunteer to help the
prophet. Yet many today under the
garb of humility refuse to confess
their faith in Christ. For Christian
soldiers to keep in hiding when the
fight for righteousness rages is a
mark of cowardice. During Christ's
ministry it was necessary for him to
draw forth from his disciples a con-
fession of his divinity, when Peter
answers, "Thou art the Christ of
God."
