made the first of the year against Idaho and the Bremerton all-star team of the navy, a new era of football is believed by close followers of the game to have been begun at Oregon. Taken as a whole, the showing made this year with that of last, with practically the same members of the team filling their old positions, allows no comparison.

Coach Bezdek of Chicago came back to Oregon this year for the purpose of coaching her teams because he was here seven years ago, and so fell in love with the University and the old Oregon spirit that he could not resist the temptation to return when given the opportunity. He is a gentleman from start to finish—something which the average football enthusiast does not always couple with the phrase football coach.

It is remarked that he has not been heard to have said one single word that would shock anybody, either during practice or even between the halves, when there is usually considerably sulphur in the air.

Bezdek is not that kind of a coach.

But what has he done for Oregon? He has turned out the best team that she has had for years, with the least number of injuries and least number of hard feelings.

It has been predicted by Northwest scribes that Oregon has another Alexander, and that it only remains for the required length of time to elapse before it will crop out.

Bezdek will also have charge of the coaching of all the other branches of men's athletics through the year. During the summer he scouts for one of the big Eastern baseball teams, and so it is needless to say that he is somewhat acquainted with this game.

After the game with the Multnomah Club, which will be played on Multnomah field Thanksgiving Day, the curtain will fall on football at Oregon for another year, with the slogan still ringing in the student's ears, "Beat Doble."
