Inferior Grades Bring the Cattle Prices Down

(Herald Special Service) PORTLAND, Nov. 24.—A large proportion of last week's cattle business was on a lower basis, due to the general inferiority of the stuff marketed. When an occasional load of prime steers or cows appeared in the yards, order buyers snapped them up quickly at top prices. A steer sale Monday at \$7.75 and a load or two at \$7.50 and \$7.60 is an example, but the bulk of sales were at \$7 and \$7.25. The poorest lot of cows and heifers seen here for weeks caused the session to drag. Killers are simply oversupplied with poor beef quality. Other butcher lines were steady. The hog market faltered on Tuesday when the trade weakened about 10 cents, but during the remainder of the period \$8 proved to be a substantial price basis for choice light-weight swine. A big volume of business was transacted Monday and Wednesday. Monday had the second largest single day's run of the year, but live pork outlet seems to be broad enough to absorb liquidation to date. The sheep house furnished some excitement Monday when a few decks of fancy lambs sold at \$6, a new record for the season. Other varieties brought \$5.50 and \$5.75. Nothing sensational visited the mutton division, as most of the transactions consisted of medium grade ewes, selling around \$3.65 and \$4.75. Prime ewes sold at \$4. Best yearlings are considered steady at \$4.75 and \$4.99; old sheep at \$4.50.

American Astronomers Are to Chin With Mars

PARIS, Nov. 24.—French astronomers are watching with a great deal of interest the preparations of American star-gazers to try to find out in January if Mars is inhabited and is trying to signal the earth. "We shall have to content ourselves with seeing what we can do from France," declared M. Bigourdan, of the Paris observatory, "because we lack the money to transport ourselves to the equator, as American observers will do. However, we shall await with considerable eagerness to hear the result of the trip, for Mars will be very close to the earth in January, and perhaps many of the problems now vexing us about Mars may be solved."

OREGON AND WASHINGTON DISTRICTS ARE ALL MADE THE OFFER BY THE PORTLAND UNION STOCKYARDS COMPANY. (Herald Special Service) PORTLAND, Nov. 24.—Every city and country school in Oregon and Washington that wants a pig can have one with the compliments of the Portland Union Stockyards. The only condition attaching to the gift pigs will be a requirement that each school accepting one keep an accurate record of the kind, quality and the cost of the food that is given it. This will be for the purpose of determining the cost of feeding and preparing a pig for market. It is expected that the pigs will be sold when they reach a marketable size. The stockyards will buy them back at the market price, and the schools can use the money as they choose. Stockyards officials expect the boys and girls of the various schools to compete for the distinction of making the most money out of their pork stock.
