The new proprietor is A. J. Wiggins of El Paso, Texas. Mrs. Wiggins will reach here tomorrow, and, like Mrs. Keller, she will take an active part in the management of the restaurant. Since boyhood Mr. Wiggins has been engaged in hotel and restaurant work, and will conduct the establishment along the same lines that made it popular under the Keller management.

Mr. and Mrs. J. J. Keller and son Paul (yes, and the dog, Teddy), will leave later in the month for their former home, Fremont, Ohio, where they will spend Christmas. They will return in the spring, as Mr. Keller has many investments here.

During the time the Kellers have conducted the cafe they have proven themselves capable restaurateurs,

and they have also been active in the city's civic and social life. The daily chats at the cashier's desk with either Mr. or Mrs. Keller will be sadly missed by many.
