Little Stories of Interest From Yesterday's Lost News

San Francisco—The trial of Leah Anderson, charged with killing J. D. Van Baalen, a newspaper man, has been set for January 6th.

Washington—Plans for Californians here to celebrate the signing of the Hetch Hetchy bill by President Wilson have been abandoned, owing to the illness of the executive.

Washington—The senate this afternoon by a vote of 49 to 35, defeated the first of the Hitchcock amendments to the currency reform bill. This was designed to fix the number of regional reserve banks at four, and required the sale to the public of the first stock in regional reserve banks.

Washington—Senator Perkins of California introduced in the senate a bill appropriating \$2,000,000 for the construction of a 1,000-foot drydock in San Francisco Bay.
