SPORTSMEN PAID BIG SUM TO HUNT

OVER THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS PAID INTO THE STATE TREASURY FOR PRIVILEGE OF HUNTING AND FISHING HERE

In the year of 1913, sportsmen in Klamath county donated a total of \$2,581 to the fish and game commission's funds for the privilege of hunting and fishing in Klamath county. Deputy County Clerk Chas. De Lap has just compiled complete figures.

Of this amount \$1,677 represents the amount spent by hunters securing licenses, and \$1,153 was taken in from those desiring to fish. Some bought combination licenses, and these netted \$396.

Non-resident anglers spent \$15 for licenses. The non-resident hunters, though, were more numerous, and from their licenses there was derived a total of \$349.

Manager Idea Appeals to Many Texas Places

DALLAS, Texas, Jan. 28.—Residents of a dozen or more towns and cities today started a campaign to have the manager plan similar to that adopted in Dayton, Ohio, established.

The movement, while not generally systematized, is spreading throughout the Lone Star state. It was prophesied here today that managers will be appointed in many Texas cities this year.

Amarillo, at a recent election, voted to employ a town manager at a large

salary, in the belief that such an official and such a municipal government would save the city thousands of dollars—more than enough to pay his salary, and give Amarillo a far better government than it has heretofore enjoyed.

A committee of Denton, Texas, citizens, also has decided on a similar course, and plans are being mapped out today to have the Denton charter so changed that the city commissioners will be put on nominal salaries, and a town manager put at the head at a salary of \$3,000 or more.
