Chief Two Guns White Calf on the Move

Chief Two Guns White Calf's tribe on the Blackfoot reservation, near the Glacier National Park in Montana movements the other day. The photograph shows the chief's personal household en route. The two ponies at the rear of the line are engaged in hauling the "travois"—the oldest form of transportation on the North American continent, the canoe and the human leg being excepted. As soon as the Indian got the pony he began to haul his effects just as the Blackfeet in the picture. It was hundreds of years later before the screaking Red River cart became a rival of the travols. But it was brought to the Blackfoot country by the white men. The travols is the Indian's own invention. On the day this photograph was taken it was announced that men would try to fly across the sea. Atrip by wing around the world was proposed. A crew of English seamen died in their submarine. Progress hasn't touched the Blackfoot. He prefers his travois.


