## WANTS CITY TO GET LAKE LAND

CONGRESSMAN SINNOTT INTRODUCES A BILL IN THE HOUSE, GIVING KLAMATH FALLS LAND FOR A PARK

Congressman Sinnott has introduced a bill in the house conveying to the city of Klamath Falls all of the unsurveyed lands along the Eastern shore of Lake Ewauna for a public park.

The meander line of the government survey extends quite a distance out from the present water line, and it is claimed that there is about 100 acres of unsurveyed land lying along the shore of the lake between the water and the meander line.

There is a question as to whether the United States or the state of Oregon owns this land, so in order to be safe the city park board some time ago made an application to the state for the purchase of the land. If it should be decided that the state does not have title to the land, then the bill introduced by Sinnott will be pressed.

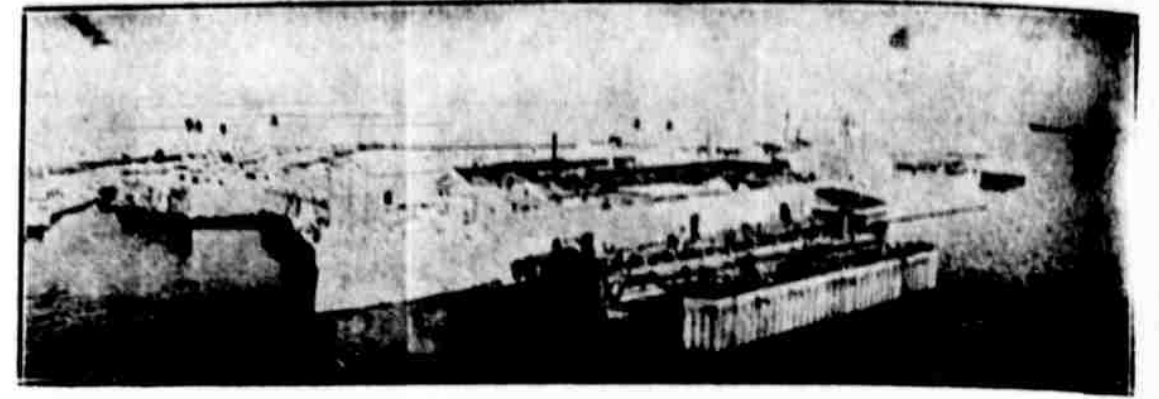

The bulletin presents in its several tables data for the United States and its outlying possessions in 1910 and 1900, with estimates of the population July 1, 1914, 1913, 1912, 1911 and 1910. Similar data is also presented for the different states in the Union. There is also presented a statement of the white and colored population as of July 1st of each of the years 1914, 1913, 1912, 1911 and 1910. These estimates, however, have been confined to the states having a considerable proportion of colored population, no estimate being presented for any state that did not have 50,000 or more colored inhabitants on April 15, 1910, or at least 10 per cent of its population colored.

reptance of the mediation offer means that he is seeking peace. They do not say, though, what this hope is based on.

Wilson demands in his offer that Huerta retire as president, and that the constitutional form of government be restored. If this is done, and a full apology made by Huerta, America will withdraw.

The mediators admit that their task will be Herculean. The mediation matter was taken up with the United States Saturday afternoon by representatives of Brazil, Argentine and Chile. The other South American nations have since given their support.

## Anti-Mormons Hold Big Demonstration

NEW YORK, April 27.—Speakers who have promised sensational revelations of the alleged continued practice of plural wives among the Mormons of the country, and especially of those of Utah, are to address the anti-Mormon demonstration planned for tonight at Carnegie hall.

An attack is to be made by several speakers on Joseph F. Smith, head of the Mormon church, and alleged proofs of activities against the United States government itself were promised today.

As a part of tonight's program at State Senator Cannon of Utah, who was once an elder in the Mormon church, will read what he says is a portion of the Mormon ritual, as follows:

"You and each of you do covenant and promise that you will pray and never cease to pray Almighty God to avenge the blood of the prophets upon this nation, and that you will teach the same to your children and to your children's children unto the third and fourth generation."

## LOCAL MOVIES ARE DEVELOPED TODAY

SCENES ALONG THE RIVER WILL BE SHOWN AT PICTURE HOUSE JUST AS SOON AS THEY CAN BE MADE READY

This afternoon the Miller Photo company developed nearly a hundred feet of film of motion pictures taken on the Klamath River. As soon as a transparency, or positive, is made from the developed negative, the pictures will be shown at one of Houston's play houses.

To develop the pictures the film is wound around a large drum; the drum is lowered, so the lowest side is submerged in the proper solution, and is slowly turned.

After developing a negative a new film is placed with it, and the two run through the machine again, which process prints the transparency.

A German physician has invented a sprayer for iodine which permits its use for dressing wounds without the danger of bad results through its violent caustic properties.

For smaller cities and towns a recently devised fire alarm employs an enlarged and more than usually powerful automobile horn, electrically operated, to sound signals.

A device to push a printer's hands out of the way of danger when feeding a platen press has been patented in the United States and England by an English inventor.

An American Greaves company has obtained a contract to supply 10,000 revolvers to the Greek army after competing with rival makers from several European countries.

## THIRTY-EIGHT TO PARTICIPATE

UP TO THE PRESENT TIME THAT MANY STATES HAVE SIGNIFIED INTENTIONS OF BEING REPRESENTED IN PANAMA-PACIFIC

SAN FRANCISCO, April 27.—Thirty-eight states of the Union have up to the present signified their intention of participating in the Panama-Pacific International Exposition to be held here during 1915. The appropriations range from \$35,000 by North Dakota, to \$700,000 by the state of New York. Every state and territory in the Union will be represented in some way in the exhibit palaces.

The twelve main exposition palaces which are now either completed or in course of construction upon the grounds are: The Palace of Machinery, the Palace of Education, the Palace of Food Products, the Palace of Agriculture, the Palace of Mines and Metallurgy, the Palace of Varied Industries, the Palace of Liberal Arts, the Palace of Manufactures, the Palace of Transportation, the Palace of Horticulture, the Palace of Fine Arts and Festival Hall.

In Northern Arizona, Utah, Nevada, Southern Idaho and Western Wyoming, the fires on national forests set by campers have decreased in four years from nearly a third to approximately one-fifth. Lightning fires have increased from less than one-fourth to nearly one-half. The relatively larger proportion from lightning, however, is due partly to decrease in other causes.
