With Bullet in Heart, Recovers From Injury

VIENNA, April 30—Alive and well with a bullet in his heart, is the report made of an unusual if not unprecedented case in medical annals, by Dr. Finsterer, to the Vienna Society of Physicians and Surgeons. Dr. Finsterer was called to attend a young man brought to an emergency hospital. He had attempted suicide by shooting himself. He was unconscious, but still alive. By means of the x-ray it was seen that the bullet was actually in the heart. It was loose in one of the heart chambers and with every movement of that organ the bullet moved about. After consultation with Professor Hochberg, the famous surgeon, it was decided to remove the bullet from the heart where the bullet entered, and that without attempting to remove the bullet. This was done. After two weeks it was certain that the young man would get well. Four weeks later another x-ray examination showed the bullet had been "healed in" near the lower edge of the heart, and gave the patient little or no trouble.
