SALEM, May 13—The United Railways company, part of the Hill system, has been making a showing during the past week of revenues on the Linton and Portland line, making an increase of fares from 5 cents to 10 cents on the ground that it costs 9 cents to haul a passenger between those two points.

Pursuant to an ordinance duly passed by the common council on the 27th day of April, 1914, approved by the mayor on the 28th of April, 1914, notice is hereby given that bids will be received by the Police Judge of the city of Klamath Falls, Oregon, at his office at the corner of Main and Second streets, in said city, up to and including the 25th day of May, 1914, at 8 o'clock p. m., for the improvement of Third street in said city, from its intersection with Main street to California avenue, including intersections, by grading to the established grade to a width of 24 feet; and by hard surfacing said roadway 24 feet wide from Main street to Grant street with six inches of crushed rock, with an asphalt binder and surface valley gutters, all without curbing, but providing necessary drainage.
