Hundreds of thousands of persons watched the transfer of the caskets of the seventeen Vera Cruz heroes from the Battery to the Brooklyn navy yard. President Wilson rode in the procession up Broadway and past the city hall in New York. There the procession halted, while thousands looked on. The caskets were born on caissons through streets that were jammed, and over the Manhattan bridge to the navy yard in Brooklyn.
