After several hundred dollars had LAKEVIEW JAUNT been expended by Lake county to bring about the arrest of Buck Lindsey at Albany, and after Deputy Sherif Walter Dent had gone to Albany for the prisoner, and had him almost here, Lindsey last night made his escape by jumping from the train just before it pulled into Kiamath Falls, and just a few minutes before he would have been lodged behind the bars of the Klamath county Jall for sate keeping over night.

Between Midland and Klamath Pails, Lindsey asked permission to go into the lavatory on the train, which the officer granted. The prisoner opened the window and jumped from the train, and it was not until the train reached Klamath Falls that the escape was discovered.

The authorities are making a march for the escape, and all the nearby authorities have been telephoned and telegraphed. The recapture of Lindsey is regarded as certain.

Lindsey is wanted in Lake county on a charge of stealing horses in Warner Valley. Four of the horses he is alleged to have taken are owned by the deputy sheriff from whose

custody he escaped.
