ALBANY JURIST TO FINISH LAKE COUNTY TERM

While Kelly Weighs on Legal Ques tions at Lakeview, Benson Is Holding a Term at Salem-This Allows Him to He Close to the State He and to Make a Contest Should He Find It Necessary.

PORTLAND, June 8-Circuit Judge Henry L. Benson, who lost by thirteen votes to Justice McNary the fourth republican nomination as supreme justice, today put public accountants work recounting the returns from Multnomah county. He may also check over again the vote from Washington county.

In a letter to County Clerk Coffey. Henson said he is making the recount merely to satisfy himself. Should an error be discovered, he will be in a position to demand a recount.

"Just one majority is enough to make me lie down and acknowledge that I have been defeated,"said Judge Benson. "All that I want to know that there has been no blunder in the findings of the canvassing bo these two counties. I have been urged to start a legal contest against Justice McNary by demanding a recount of ballots in Multnomah county, but I shall not do so, at least according to present appearances.

"There may have been some errors in counting the ballots in certain precincts, but I am depending only on learning whether any errors occurred in the canvass and announcement of the returns.
