the fourth, when Thrasher opened with a single, stole second, went to third when Mesner beat out a bunt, and scored when Ambrose cracked one to a safe spot in left. Browne lived on a fielder's choice, as did Maxwell, but Mesner was forced at the plate on Maxwell's grounder. Noel sacrificed, scoring Ambrose. Dale then lifted a long fly that looked safe for a three-bagger at least, but little Edmonds scooped under it for the third out. Two hits, two runs.

Two errors and a fielder's choice gave the visitors their fourth and last tally in the ninth. Maxwell cut off what looked like two runs in the eighth by the fastest fielding work ever seen on the local diamond. With runners on second and third, and two down, Heaton slammed one between first and second that was ticketed through to the railroad track, but Maxwell performed a miracle, and got his hand on the

ball, making the throw to Dale without stopping or turning. Regardless of the errors, the game Sunday was full of pep and ginger.

Notice of Filing of the Proposed Assessment Roll
The Common Council of the city of Klamath Falls, Oregon, having ascertained and determined the proportionate share for which each lot, part of lot, block and acreage property shall be liable for the improvement of Eighth street, from Main to High street, High street from Eighth to Ninth street, Ninth street from High to Prospect street, Prospect street from Ninth to Upham street, Upham street from Prospect to White avenue, White avenue from Upham to Delta

street, and having on the 8th day of June, 1914, filed in the office of the Police Judge of said city a statement thereof, which said statement is known and designated as the "PROPOSED ASSESSMENT ROLL" for said improvement.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that said Common Council did by resolution fix Monday, the 29th day of June, 1914—said date being a date upon which a regular meeting of said council will be held—as the time for hearing and determining all objections to such assessment, and having heard and determined such objections, if any there be, said Common Council will on said date proceed to assess the proportionate share and part of the cost of such improvement in accordance with the benefit accrued upon each lot, part of lot, block or acreage property. Each and every owner of property liable for the cost of such improvement is hereby referred to said assessment roll on file in the office of the Police Judge for detailed information.

The boundaries within which the

property lies that is benefited and is to be assessed for the cost of said improvement, is all that property lying adjacent to the said streets as far as improved, and extending back from the side lines of said streets to the center of the respective blocks lying adjacent to said streets so far as improved.
