

Sponge Method

Try the following recipe prepared by Professor Joseph Becker,

One cake Fleischmann's yeast, 1 1/2 quarts lukewarm water, 2 tablespoonfuls lard or butter, 1 tablespoon salt, 4 % quarts sifted Crater Lake flour, 2 tablespoonfuls sugar. Dissolve the yeast and sugar in one quart of the lukewarm water, and add to it 1 1/4 quarts of sifted Crater Lake flour, or sufficient to make an ordinary sponge. Beat well. Cover and set aside to rise for about 11/2 hours in a warm place. When well risen add to it the pint of lukewarm water, lard or butter, the remainder of the flour, or enough to make a moderately firm dough, and lastly, the salt. Knead thoroughly, place in greased bowl. Cover and let rise for from 11/2 to 2 hours. When light, mould into loaves and place in well greased baking pans, cover and let rise again for about an hour. When light, bake 40 to 50 minutes, reducing the heat of the oven after first 10 minutes. This recipe makes four large loaves. The whole process takes from 5 1/4 to 6 hours, and if followed closely, will produce excellent results.
