Sponge Method

Try the following recipe prepared by Professor Joseph Becker, the world's greatest chef. . Professor Becker usade a careful test of CRATER LAKE Flour for us and we guarantee results if his directions for its use are followed:

One cake Fleischmann's yeast, 1 1/2 quarts lukewarm water, \$ tablespoonfuls lard or butter, 1 tablespoon salt, 4 % quarts sifted Crater Lake flour, 2 tablespoonfuls sugar.
