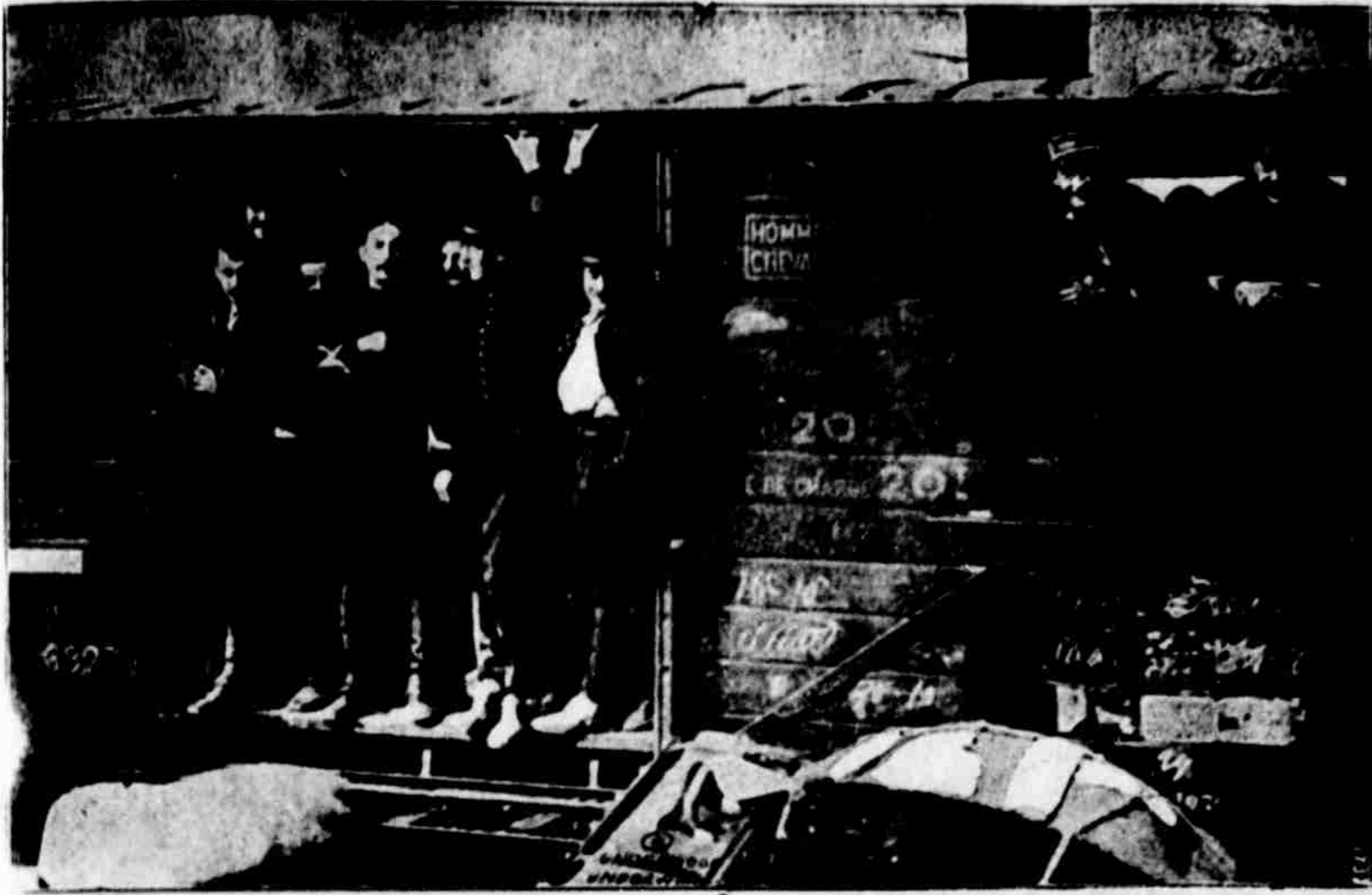


First Picture of French Troops Entraining for the Front



This photograph was taken in Paris after the mobilization order for the French army had been signed by President Poincaré. They were on their way to Belgium to help hold off the Germans, who had just started their attack on Liege and the country surrounding. It is one of the very few photographs which have come from the continent of Europe since the war was declared. The photographers, like newspaper men, are not wanted wherever there are war movements to be shown. Unless photographers are willing to take more risks it is possible that very few of the movements of the troops in the great war will be sent to the United States.
