

Cut of U. S. Timber Greatest This Year

(Herald Special Service)
PORTLAND, Aug. 31.—The district forester at Portland reports that there has been an increase of more than 64,000,000 board feet of timber cut in sales on the national forests in Washington, Oregon and Alaska during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1914, over the previous fiscal year.

The total amount cut in timber sales during the fiscal year was 175,251,000 board feet, and the average price received for this timber was \$1.18 per thousand board feet. In addition, 14,624,000 board feet of timber was given away free of charge to settlers living in and near the national forests.

During the same period a total of 277,455,000 board feet of timber was sold in 1,011 timber sales, but over 95 per cent of these sales involved 1100 worth of timber or less, and were made to those who are dependent upon the national forests for their supply of timber for fuel and other domestic uses.

On eleven of the national forests more timber was given away free of charge to needy settlers and homesteaders than was sold. Approximately 74 per cent of the material given away consisted of dead timber. In this manner not only were the needs of the local inhabitants supplied, but the fire danger was reduced on account of the removal of this inflammable material.

The largest amount of timber cut on any one national forest was 42,355,000 board feet on the Tongass national forest in Alaska. The largest amount sold on any one forest during the last fiscal year was 128,882,000 board, on the Olympic national forest in Washington.

The total receipts for timber on the national forests in Oregon, Washington and Alaska during the last fiscal year was \$205,285.59.

Twenty-five per cent of this and of all other receipts from the same forests is given to the counties in which they are situated, to be used for schools and roads, and an additional 10 per cent is expended by the secretary of agriculture for the improvement of roads and trails, primarily for the benefit of the settlers and homesteaders within the forests.

Reno Now Full of Big Suffragettes

RENO, Nev., Aug. 31.—This former seat of divorce activity is now one of the hottest suffrage spots in the West. With the Nevada Equal Suffrage League working hard for the women's rights amendment to be voted on in November and the Nevada Association Opposed to Equal Suffrage striving with equal energy to defeat it, the "votes-for-women" issue is becoming overshadowingly important in the present state campaign.

The "anti" policy has been to wage their fight by means of literature to voters throughout the state, and this will be supplemented late in the campaign by a series of addresses by representatives of the national organization. The suffragists have not despised literature, but they have made a speaking campaign from the start. Thus far Nevada women have done most of the talking. Distinguished orators from other states are expected later.

Miss Jane Addams of Chicago is one of those who will tour the state late in the fall. Dr. Anna Howard Shaw is expected about the same time. Mrs. Grace Cotterill of Seattle will lend her aid, and Dr. C. F. Aked of San Francisco, is scheduled to spend a week in the state just before the campaign ends.

One of the features of the contest has been the anti-suffrage activity of George Winfield, a dominant figure in Nevada mining and banking circles, who says he will leave the state if the suffrage cause wins. Miss Anna Martin, state president of the equal suffrage league, declared today that the suffrage cause will win if the women work hard enough.

NEARLY THIRD OF THE STATE'S INHABITANTS ARE ENGAGED IN SOME PHASE OF AGRICULTURAL WORK

(Herald Special Service)
WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 31.—There are 305,164 persons in Oregon that work for a living, and 88,114 of them are employed upon the farm, according to a report which has just been issued by the United States census bureau. Of the persons engaged in agricultural pursuits, the bulk of them are farm operators and farm laborers. The farm operators number 38,581, and 37,292 are men and 1,289 are women. There are 27,126 farm laborers in the state, and 26,269 are males and 867 females.

There are 1,492 dairy farmers in the state, and they employ 589 laborers and eleven foremen. There are also 2,244 persons in the state whose principal source of income is from stock raising. The number of cowboys and sheep herders in this state is 3,029.

In the entire United States there are 11,550,270 persons over 10 years of age, and 38,167,336, or 52 per cent of this number, are engaged in gainful occupations. Of the gainfully occupied, 12,659,202, or 33 per cent, are engaged in agriculture. There are 5,865,000 farm operators in the nation, and they employ 5,975,000 laborers.

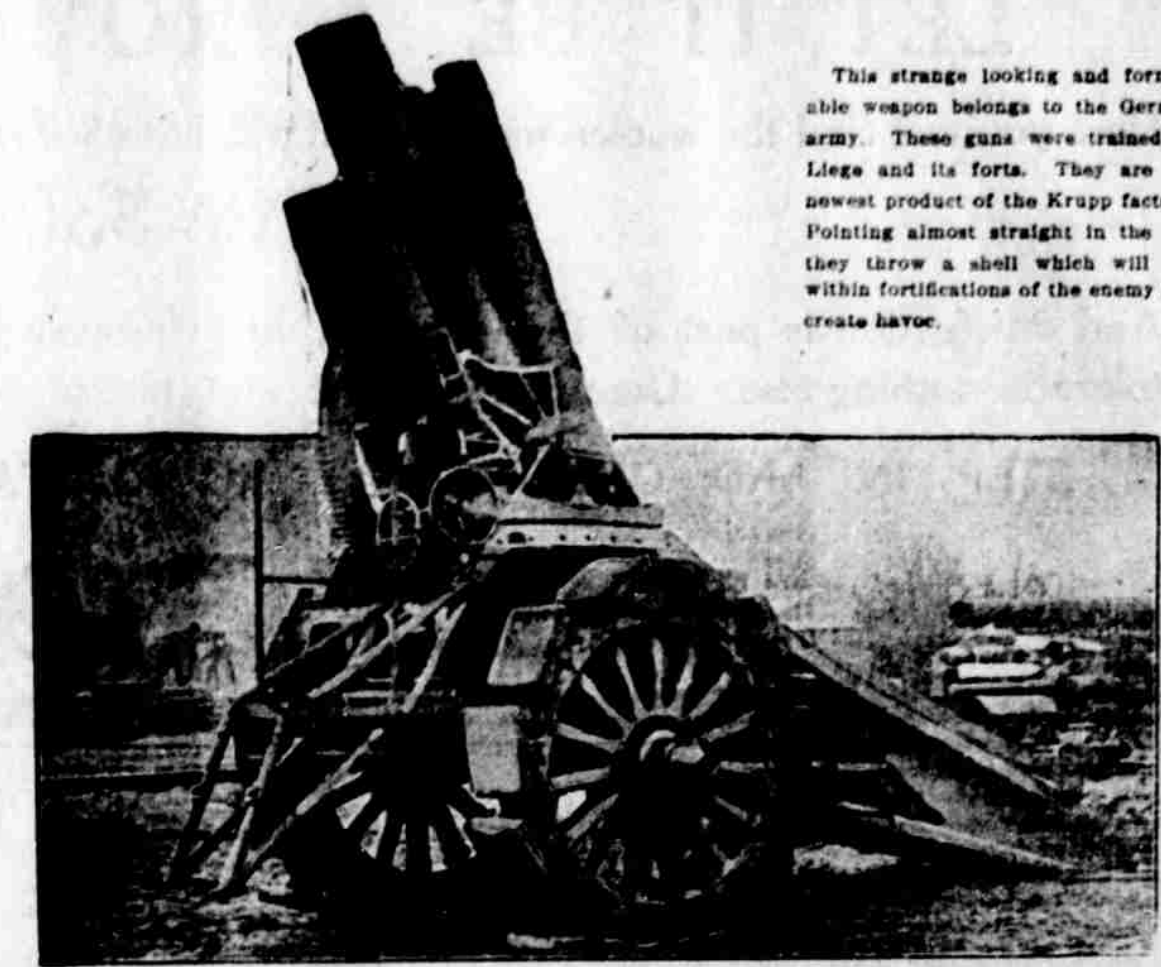
