GERMANS ON OFFENSE NOW

Retreat Stops; Allies' Losses Heavier

PARIS, Sept. 15 .- The war office at Bordeaux at 3 o'clock telegraphed

Yesterday the German legions began to resist the French advance at the line they have established. This battle front is established on a line through the forests at la Aisle and Craonne and at the center to the north of Rhieses and Chalons.

This is the first admission the nar office has made, since the German retreat of a week ago, that the German army had begun to return the attack. It is believed that the kaiser's soldiery has reached intrenched positions previously prepared by them.

That a big battle is imminent is obvious, now that the retreat has stopped. In addition, another German force is concentrating and preparing for a stand east of Aimens. If they can reform before the allies can prevent it they are expected to resume the offensive.

According to the latest accounts from the front, the German resistsuce is becoming more serious. They are bringing the artiflery into play, and the losses of the alties are heavier.
