# GERMAN FORCE **REFORMING TO** MAKE ATTACK

DORDEAUX, Sept. 16 .- War Minister Millerand announced at cabinet neeting today that the situation is satisfactory to the allies. He says the Germans have stopped their precipitate flight, but are retiring slowly, and that they are repulsed wherever they attempt to resume the offensive.

BEELIN, (via The Hague), Sept. 16.—The war office announces that the Germans have checked the allies offensive everywhere in France. The general staff reports show that the new plans are working nicely.
