STILL NO REPORT

T HAS been several weeks since Mrs. C. A. Moore dragged Klamath Falls into more notoriety by a long letter to Governor West, in which she made some ugly allegations regarding conditions here, and since the governor spattered still more mud on our reputation by giving the letter full publicity in Portland and Salem papers.
