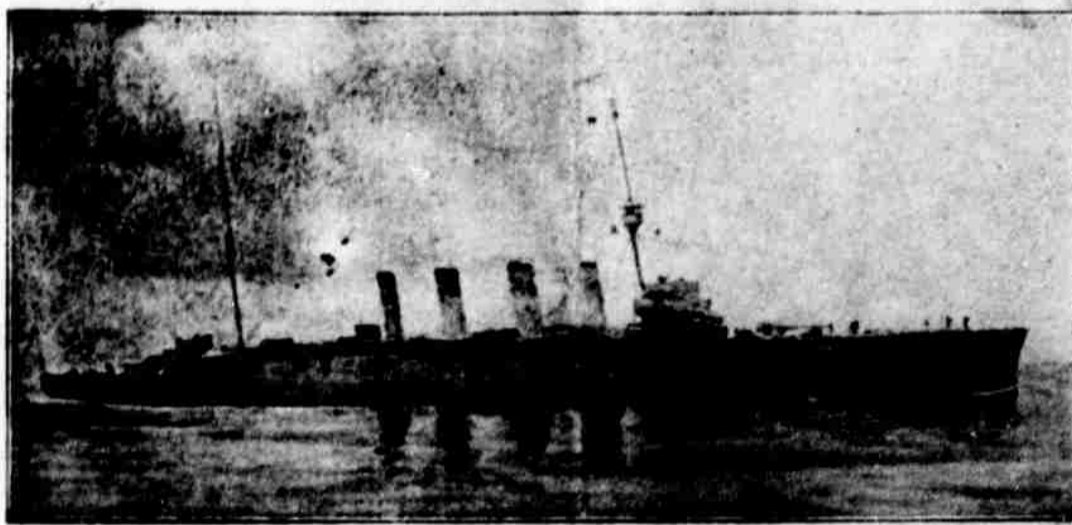


ARTILLERYMEN IN FLANDERS ACTIVE ALL ALONG FRONT
