The question of so amending the city charter as to give the council the authority to enter into an agreement with the reclamation service for the taking over of the Ankeny canal, with obligations, etc., and to settle for these water rights in the way it seems most advisable, is to be put up to the

people of Klamath Falls at an election to be held within sixty days' time. A resolution to this effect was passed at last night's meeting of the council. This is in accordance with the conditions imposed by the government before entering into an agreement for the transfer of title to the troublesome ditch.

The purpose is to reduce operating expenses in the paper mills by eliminating a duplication of fixed charges, thus enabling them to compete with British Columbia and Norway and Sweden, which countries have been active in the markets of the Pacific coast since the removal of the tariff.

Library Club Gets More Aid From City

Under the next year's administration of the city, the Women's Library Club is to receive a little more than \$50 a month for the maintenance of the library. Heretofore the city has been paying \$30 a month toward the maintenance of this great beneficial institution.

Until a few weeks ago the library charged a small fee for the use of its books, although maintaining a free reading room. Since then, though, the books are furnished free to the public, and as this has brought about increased expense while cutting off the revenue derived from the rental of

books, the library has been facing a deficit. Last night a delegation from the club attended the council meeting. Mrs. Luella Stearns, president, and Mrs. Robert E. Wattenburg, secretary, told the council of the condition the library is in, and asked for an appropriation of \$50 a month hereafter, agreeing to turn the library over to the city, if that was desired. The phase of the question was not taken up by the council, but provision was made for the increased appropriation.

LOG CABIN WALNUT CAKE

Sift 3 teaspoons baking powder into 3 cups of flour and mix thoroughly. Add 3 eggs well beaten, a dessert-spoon butter, 1/2 cup sweet milk and 1 cup Log Cabin Syrup. Mix thoroughly and then stir in 1 cup of chopped walnuts. Bake in deep tins in a moderate oven.
