PORTLAND, Dec. 1.—A city ordinance adopted by the vote of the people recently, providing for the collection of household water rates every three months, instead of monthly as heretofore and making the rates chargeable to the premises served, rather than to the consumer, went in-

to effect today. The change will result in a large saving to the municipality in postage, stationary and office help.

If the consumer fails to pay his or her water rent the owner of the premises is held responsible under the new system.

Washington Prepares
for "Short Session"

WASHINGTON, Dec. 1.—The capital is getting ready to welcome returning congressmen. The regular "short" session, the third and last of the 63d Congress, convenes in less than a week from today, on December 7th.

Already the vanguard of political leaders are here, laying out the program for legislative work and political jockeying.

Several appropriation committees

assemble today to begin work framing the big list of supply measures.

Members from the cotton states will hold a preliminary meeting this week to map out a campaign to push through cotton relief legislation.

The House Naval Committee was scheduled to begin work on the big annual naval budget, which this year will probably aggregate \$144,000,000, and the call for construction of two new dreadnoughts, six torpedo boat destroyers and eight submarines, launching the annual fight of the "big" and "little" navy Congressmen.
