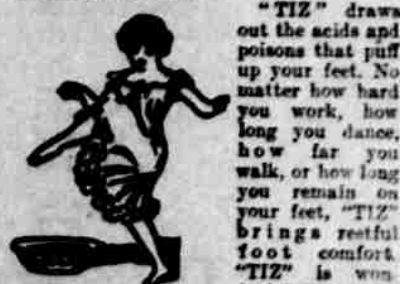

LOWER THE TAXES

ALTOGETHER the tax totals in Multnomah county will be nearly two million dollars less than for the preceding year.

In nearly every county in the state lower tax levies have been made, and in almost every city the same plan has been followed.

In 1914 the people of Oregon paid about \$24,000,000 in taxes, or about one-third of the gross income from the farms.

No state can prosper under such conditions, and the record for the past two years bears this out, that few people came here.

Altogether the census shows an increase in ten years of only about 45,000 population added to the state outside of the cities.

The tax burdens must be lessened if capital is to come to Oregon in large amounts, and even Oregon banks suffer from high taxes.

The statement of President Gilman is that 12 per cent of the gross receipts of the HUI system are eaten up this year in taxes.

It is any wonder that it is very difficult to get money for development of railroad enterprises in a state so burdened?

A campaign is on to cut out half a million dollars in the running expenses of the state, and compel all officials to turn in fees.

The fight to lessen the burdens of taxation must be made if the state is to get on to the prosperity basis and stay there.

COUNTY JUDGE FOR LOW TAXES

COUNTY JUDGE MCKNIGHT of Linn county says his county is free from debt, and will make the lowest levy of any county in the state.

He says the incoming legislature is pledged to retrenchment, and the people are resting easy on that score, but therein is great danger.

He says the last election established the fact that the people are too heavily burdened with taxes and demand material reductions.

WHY LIGHT FROM LEFT SIDE?

THE WELL KNOWN fact that, when using the eyes for any near work, the illumination should come from the left side rather than the right is often disregarded. Let anyone who considers the matter of little importance once demonstrate to himself the difference and he will never forget it.

Take a pencil and paper and try to write while in such a position that the light will fall from the right side. The shadow of the hand or pencil or both thrown on the paper in such a way as partly to cover the characters one is making. This necessitates a closer viewpoint and conscious strain on the eyes.

Now let the position of the writer be reversed so that the light falls on the work from the left side. He will notice that the shadows fall away from the work he is doing and leaves the field unobscured.

In making the change he cannot help but notice the feeling of ease that immediately is experienced by the eyes. This applies to any other kind of near work in which the fingers work under the guidance of the eyes. This fact should be remembered in planning schoolrooms, workrooms, offices and any places where steady close work is to be performed.

SOME MINOR WAR NEWS FROM EUROPE

LITTLE STORIES FROM THE FRONT THAT ARE COMING IN THROUGH THE CAPITALS OF THE NATIONS NOW FIGHTING EACH OTHER—SOME ARE TRIVIAL, BUT ALL ARE INTERESTING AT THIS TIME.

LONDON, Nov. 17 (By mail to New York).—Two women of the peasant class waited outside the Prefect's office in Paris. The elder went in, returning presently with a set look on her worn face.

"Is it well with Jean?" asked the younger woman eagerly.

"Yes, it is well!"

"And with Henri and Paul?"

"Yes, all is well with them—they are all with God—I am glad to have been their mother."

This is one of the memories brought back by Mrs. Neave, wife of a British army officer, who has just returned from a journey through France. "The French are a changed nation," she declares. They have become altogether serious. No one is smiling in France now. There are no jokes and no rejoicing, even over victory. Every third woman is in black, and people stand about the streets in groups listening while the madame tells how her husband was killed.

"One touch of comedy, which have made me rock with laughter at ordinary times, I encountered at Lyons. Some fifty German prisoners had just arrived from the front, and I noticed that they nearly all had their hands in their trouser pockets. I remarked on this to an official, and he replied in a matter of fact way: 'Oh! yes, they tried to escape, so we took away their suspenders. That is why they have their hands in their big pockets.'"

The prisoners were in rags or in old garments which the French seem to have given them. I was astonished that there was no demonstration. Two small boys spat at them, but they were told to stop. A troop of soldiers were leaving Lyons that day. Fine looking fellows they were, all well over forty, but they presented a curious appearance, for each man had a large flat cake of bread strapped across his manly breast and a bottle of water. From Lyons to Paris is one vast camp, and we travelled in zig-zag fashion, picking up soldiers here and there. At one siding a trainload of British wounded arrived from Soissons. Pioneers exchanging greetings with the French. "Good-bye, men," said a Scott. "Bon souvenir," replied a Frenchman. The Highlander pointed to his wounded leg, and said, "yes souvenir de Soissons."

British recruits are now being given the opportunity of learning French and German before going to the front. Special classes have been organized for the London Territorials at the Duke of York's Schools and the Royal Sanitary Institute. Out of 400 men over 500 volunteered to take lessons after their days drill. The Young Men's Christian Association expects soon to provide teachers in three hundred camps throughout the United Kingdom. Teachers are being supplied by the Women's Emergency Corps, and officers' wives and University lecturers are also giving their help.
