Walter Smith, Killed by Canadian Soldiers



Walter Smith is the young man of Buffalo who was shot to death by

Canadian soldiers while he was hunting ducks on the Niagara River near Fort Erie, Canada. International complications with Great Britain have been suggested as a result, but officials of both governments insist there will be no serious consequences.

Smith, with a friend, Charles Dorsch, according to accounts of the affair, were out earlier in the morning. They took their boat over into the Canadian side of the river. The Fort Erie chief of police rushed to the bank to warn them off because it was closed season for hunting ducks in Canada. Later he called members of a military company from the fort. They fired on the two men in their boat. Smith was instantly killed, while Dorsch was wounded.
