Fight for Oregon's Co-operative Fund Will Be a Hot One

(Herald Special Service)
WASHINGTON, Jan. 22.—Although Secretary Lane has informed Representative Sinnott and Senator Chamberlain of his willingness to have Congress appropriate \$450,000 for federal or co-operative irrigation work in Oregon without requiring that the state of Oregon put up a like sum—there are many legislative obstacles to be overcome before Congress will pass such a bill.

In the first place there is considerable doubt whether the committee on irrigation in the House, of which Representative Sinnott is a member, will be allowed to have jurisdiction in the matter of making these appropriations. The regular appropriation committee, of which Fitzgerald, of New York, is chairman, is jealous of this encroachment on what it considers its "divine" right to make all appropriations of every sort that it can. The question of jurisdiction was argued before Speaker Clark recently and he has taken the matter under advisement. It is doubtful

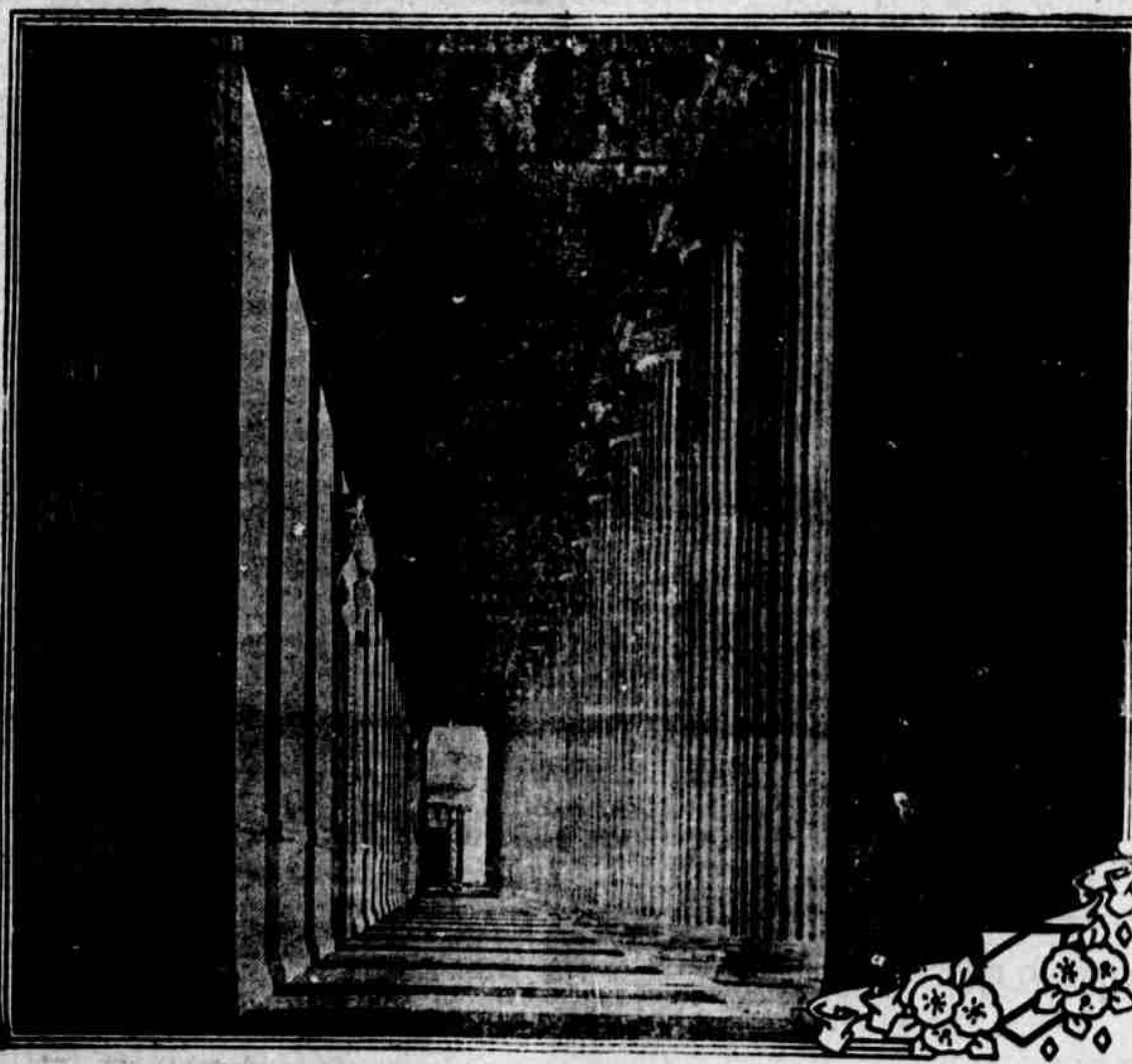
whether he will rule in favor of the irrigation committee.

But even if the matter is left in the hands of the irrigation committee there is trouble galore. A large part of the members of the committee are opposed to making an appropriation for any new projects at all in any state. They say that the reclamation funds are now so low that the way to complete projects already started is not clear. If this policy is insisted on it may be six or eight years before any new projects is undertaken.

Representative Sinnott protested vigorously against such a policy when it was tentatively suggested at the last meeting of the committee and gave his committee colleagues to understand that he would not acquiesce in such a policy nor would the people of his state complacently submit to it.

"You can't get blood out of a turnip," said Chairman Smith, of the committee, to Representative Sinnott. "We will be satisfied with a slice of the turnip," said the Oregon representative.
