Shugru, Lightweight Who Beat Welsh, World's Champion



Joe Shugru, the young lightweight champion of Jersey City, has proved he can do what many other American fighters have failed to do—beat Freddy Welsh, lightweight champion of the world, in a ten round bout. Shugru now looms up as one of the great lightweights, and he will probably be sought at higher prices by clubs in every part of the United States.

The ten round fight at Madison Square Garden in New York was an international match. Shugru recently returned from Australia, where he had beaten the lightweight champion, and annexed the title in the class there. Welsh, by virtue of his decision over the Australian champion, Willie Ritchie, the American

champion was champion of the world in his class.

Welsh, who is a very fast and clever boxer, is supposed to be at his best in ten round bouts. They are so short that he can go at top speed in them, and few of his opponents have had a chance against him in such a short time. However, Shugru fought him to a standstill. While the Jersey boy did not carry a heavy punch, he hit Welsh often. Had he more steam he might have made it dangerous for the lightweight champion. Shugru is now entitled to a long bout with Welsh, one in which the championship will be at stake. The ten round affairs in New York never decide much unless there is a knockout.

PETITION
To the Honorable County Court of the State of Oregon, for Klamath County:

We, the undersigned, your petitioners, respectfully represent as follows:

That we propose the organization of, and that it is our purpose to organize a Drainage District under the provisions of Chapter IV of Title XLII, of Lord's Oregon Laws, Section 6126 et seq. thereof, and the Act of the Legislature of the State of Oregon, which was filed in the office of the Secretary of said State of Oregon on February 23rd, 1911, being Chapter 241 of the General Laws of Oregon of 1911, and that this petition is presented for that purpose.

That each of us is the owner of land within the boundaries of the proposed Drainage District, as hereinafter set forth and particularly described;

That the lands included within the boundaries of the proposed Drainage District, as hereinafter set forth and particularly described are susceptible of one system of drainage and we desire to drain the same for the

public benefit, for sanitary purposes, for the improvement of agriculture and to prevent overflow from flood waters or any possible rise of the level of the sub-surface waters thereof;

That all of the lands included within the boundaries of said proposed Drainage District are situated in Klamath County, Oregon;
