NEW YORK, March 16.—Judge Page today denied the motion of Attorney John B. Stanchfield to allow Harry Kendall Thaw to return to New Hampshire as a sane man.

Page held that Thaw has never been discharged from the Matteawan asylum. Therefore, he ruled, the original order declaring him insane and committing him to the asylum is still in force.

The attorneys for the defense immediately applied for a writ of habeas corpus. This is returnable Friday before Justice Bijour.

In the meantime, Thaw is in the custody of the sheriff.
