THE REAL PILLAR OF SOCIETY

IT'S A GOOD rule that works both ways. When the farmer supports the home merchant and the home merchant supports the farmer, you have the real pillar of society. Likewise, the merchant has poor business when the service he gives is not the best possible. The trade must be even. The services must be mutual.

WHY THE STARS TWINKLE

THE question of childhood: "What makes stars twinkle?" was answered probably by a bit of verse or poetic fancy. But men asking the same question sought a scientific explanation, and found it.

Although we live upon its surface, we are not outside of the earth, but at the bottom of a sea of air which forms the earth's outermost layer, and extends above our heads to a height of many miles. We cannot see the stars save as we look through this atmosphere, and the light which comes through it is bent and often times distorted so as to present serious obstacles to any accurate telescopic study of the heavenly bodies.

Frequently this disturbance is visible to the naked eye, and the stars are said to twinkle, i. e., to quiver and change color many times a second, solely in consequence of a disturbed condition of the air and not from anything which goes on in the star.

This effect is more marked low down in the sky than near the zenith. It is worth noting that the planets show very little of it because the light they send to the earth comes from a disk of sensible area, while a star, being much smaller and farther from the earth, has its disk reduced practically to a mere point whose light is more easily affected by local disturbances in the atmosphere than is the broader beam which comes from the planet's disk.

At all times, whether the stars twinkle or not, their light is bent in its passage through the atmosphere, so that the stars appear to stand higher up in the sky than they really are.

Can Get Summer Home on the Upper Lake

(Herald Special Service)

PORTLAND, April 8.—According to the terms of the agricultural appropriation act recently passed by congress, it is now possible for responsible persons to lease, for periods not exceeding thirty years, not to exceed five acre tracts, within the national forests for the construction of summer homes, hotels, stores, or other recreation or public conveniences. This announcement was made today by the district forester.

Heretofore, camping sites, hotel sites and the like, could be rented at a nominal fee, under special use permit. While this permit was given for an indefinite period, it was revocable in the discretion of the department. Under the terms of the new law, however, such sites may be leased for a term of years and the lease can be canceled only for a violation of its provisions. It is, of course, optional with the applicant whether he obtains his camping site under special use permit or under lease. It is obvious that a man desiring to secure a location in the forest for a summer hotel would feel that his investment was better protected by a lease.

It should be understood that this lease law is not a homestead law in any sense, and the title to the land remains with the government. At the expiration of the lease, unless renewed, the lands will revert to the government. The improvements, however, may be disposed of by the owner as provided in the lease. The secretary has no authority under this law to issue patents.

Many people have already availed

themselves of the camping site privilege, and as a result there are many summer homes within the national forests of the Northwest. There are still many scattered lots and some surveyed tracts which offer splendid opportunities for recreation grounds in the forests, notably in such localities as Klamath Lake.

It is expected that the secretary of agriculture will approve, in the near future, regulations which will effectively carry out the provisions of this law.
