MAYOR NICHOLAS has just issued a proclamation setting aside Friday and Saturday for "Clean-Up" Days. On these days we are supposed to remove every vestige of rubbish, etc., from our premises, and make Klamath Falls much neater the "city beautiful" ideal.

But let us not let the work be stopped by the two days of effort. Let us make it continuous. Let us style it the "opening battle" of a "clean-up, paint-up, and stay-cleaned-up campaign," one that will be carried on 365 days a year.

Let us make this a campaign that will be lasting in benefits. Let us not allow it to be merely a flash in the pan makeshift, hysterical two days of effort. Let us start a campaign, continuous and constructive, one for permanent results.

An "opening battle" is necessary to focus public interest and make a concerted start, and to give direction and impetus to each of the various phases of work undertaken. Interest should be renewed once or twice a year by such an "opening battle" every spring and by one in the fall to spread the "get ready for winter" slogan.

The clean-up and paint-up plan owes much of its popularity to its emphasis upon its continuous, constructive and comprehensive spirit and program. Let the campaign run as long as it will. The longer the better for health, civic pride and town improvement and cleanliness.

CHICAGO, April 15.—Michigan's labor war in the copper mine district was recounted today to the Industrial Relations Commission. It has investigated labor conditions of the stockyards, the Pullman, Illinois Central and Harriman strikes and the telegrapher's disputes.
