

Much Attention Given to Home Improvement in Klamath

Sage brush in the southern portion of Klamath county will soon be a thing of the past. Thousands of acres which have been covered with sage brush are being put into cultivation for the first time this year.

All along the roads and foot hills small tracts of land which have been lying idle have been cleared of brush and are being planted to crops. The greatest change is noticeable along the shores of Tule Lake. This land which a few years ago was covered with water, and is being reclaimed by the government, has been plowed to the water's edge. Hundreds of acres in this section alone will raise a crop for the first time this summer.

TEACHER IN NEW HOME

Work has just been completed on a six room bungalow in Buena Vista addition for Professor T. A. Barton, head of the Shippington school. The family has just moved into it's new abode.

NEW UNDERTAKING PARLORS

Earl Whitlock is having his Undertaking parlors on the corner of Sixth and Pine, completely remodeled and rebuilt. Work has already started and is being done by J. L. Cunningham, the contractor. Several additions are being made to the present two story structure and it is planned to make this the most complete and up-to-date parlor in the state. The additions will more than double the size of the building. A full basement is being made, which will contain a modern heating plant. A large addition to the west side of the build-

ing will be used exclusively for a show room. The chapel will be greatly enlarged and an extension to the rear will contain the rostrum and pulpit. A family parlor, office and reception room are other features of the building. Over \$5,000 are being spent in rebuilding.

FINISHING CITY HALL

The work on the concrete finish on the grounds and exterior of the new city hall is being rushed by the contractors, Cofer Brothers. It is expected that this work, which was held up on account of the cold weather, will be finished within a week. There is still to be installed the automatic fire alarm system, being built by the Bergen-Combs Co.

HOME NEARING COMPLETION

The new home being erected by John Thorson on his property on Seventh and Jefferson streets, is nearing completion. The building is two story and is of the old Colonial style of architecture with a flat roof.
