BRITISH WAR LAWS

FOR A British subject to trade or to hold any commercial intercourse with any one resident in German territory is now illegal. Even contracts entered into before the war was declared are suspended.
A British subject must not pay any money debts he owes to a German in Germany while the war lasts. The payment of money between England and Germany is suspended for the time being, and so, to a certain extent, is the accumulation of interest on money lent.

The exception relates to money repayment on a certain date. If a loan is repayable on December 1, for instance, the lender may claim interest to that date, but not after it, if the war continues.

A British insurance company is not, during the war, liable for compensation for German ships seized by British ones. If a German ship owner insured in England has a ship taken as a prize by a British man-of-war he must stand the loss himself.

Contracts of partnership between British and German subjects have become void through the outbreak of war. If Smith (a Britisher) and Schmidt (a German) are partners in England, Schmidt now has no legal claim to a share of the business.

A TEN-DOLLAR BILL

Many Millions Will Regret the Death of John Bunny



"FUNNY BUNNY"

There has been no actor in the world whose death has caused a pang of regret to as many people as the demise of John Bunny, the movie comedian, who passed away yesterday. No other face is as well known all over the earth as the homely visage of Bunny, for it is estimated that there are 25,000,000 people who have laughed at the antics of this little fat man of the Vitaphone.

Bunny has been one of the highest salaried actors in the world. His picture on the billboard usually means a big attendance.

When Bunny had been acting for the films only a year and a half he went abroad to be photographed in photoplays with foreign backgrounds.

His trip proved a triumphal tour from the moment he mounted the gangplank. At every station at which the boat train to London stopped the loungers recognized him immediately he stepped upon the platform.

In London, wherever he walked he

was given a young ovation. In Paris, Berlin and St. Petersburg the cry, "there goes Bunny!" in as many respective languages, always greeted his appearance in public, and was the tune that made of him a modern Pied Piper with a throng clamoring at his heels.

In Paris they called him Monsieur, the Germans dubbed him Kintop, and the Russians conferred upon him the diminutive, Pockton.

Bunny met in the British capital an Englishman who had just landed from South Africa. "One of the last things I did before leaving Africa," the stranger told the actor, "was to go to the movies in Mombasa. I saw you in the pictures, and let me tell you, Bunny, those niggers just love you."

Bunny was the ninth John Bunny in succession. Every other John Bunny was a sailor, but John Bunny IX, decided upon a histrionic career.

Many reverses and years of discouragement were met by Bunny in his playing of minor roles. His face, later his fortune, was then his misfortune. In Portland, many years ago, he played "bits" in a stock company, but no part of prominence was entrusted to him, for despite his ability, his face was against him.

Persistent, Bunny finally won out. His services eventually became in demand on Broadway, and he played with Lew Fields and other stars.

Twenty-six years after he chose a theatrical career, Bunny entered the moving picture field, and since then he has grown in both fame and fortune. Besides sending cheer and laughter to every corner of the globe, he has race horses, two songs, a dance and numerous children named for him. His demise will be noted with regret by millions.
