Another experiment being carried on this year is the eradication of black alkali. George E. Gillette of Bonanza is co-operating in this work with Glaisyer. The tests being made this year are of two types, those where the field peas, alfalfa and red clover and dry land alfalfa are inoculated with pure cultures of bacteria, and those not inoculated. The cultures are being used as follows:

Now that the automatic fire alarm has been installed, the volunteer fire department is soon to move to the new city hall. Chief Ed Wakefield and his family are now domiciled in their new quarters, and the firemen and equipment will soon be transferred.

The sleeping quarters of the firemen and their lounging room are to be newly furnished by the city. The council last night decided to advertise for bids for the necessary bedding, furniture, etc., and the bids will be opened Monday night.

The alarm system installed provides for the better indication of the location of the fire, by means of division of the city into twenty or more fire districts. The work of districting will be taken up next week by Chief Wakefield.
