## **FUND OF \$159** A MONTH PLEDGED FOR EXPO MAN

COUNTY COURT MAKES GOOD APPROPRIATION

One Hundred Dollars a Month Will Be Given by County Toward Maintaining a Representative at the Klamath County Booth at Exposition-Besides This, flusiness Men and Others Pledge \$58.50 Monthly

A total of \$951 has been pledged for the maintaining of a well informed representative at the Klamath county booth at the Panama-Pacific International exposition for six months, according to a report prepared by the committee named by the Chamber of Commerce to solicit this

This, divided into six installments, will mean that there is \$158,50 available for the salary of a representative, and for covering other expenses incident to active participation, such as shipping down new exhibits, putting up additional signs, etc., in the Oregon building, and similar minor

Of this amount, \$100 a month will be paid by the county court. At yesterday's session of the court the matter was discussed, and expressing the opinion this was a matter that was for the benefit of everybody in Klamath county, and that the cost should be equitably borne by all, the members directed the preparation of a resolution for the appropriating of \$100 a month for six months.

WILL BE BUILT BY GOVERNMENT?

MATTER IS UP TO THE LAND-OWNERS

Reclamation Service Has Money for Commencing One of Three Apparently Feasible Extensions to the Klamath Project-Project Making Most Favorable Showing Will Be the One to Have Water on Lands.

The Reclamation service has \$100,-000 for the commencement of new extension work on the Klamath project in the fiscal year beginning July 1. Whether this extension will be the construction of the Horsefly project of 16,000 acres around Bonanza, the pumping of water to irrigate 4,700 acres above the canals between here and Olene, or the putting in of a combination gravity and pump system to irrigate 13,000 acres in the Sand Hollow country is a matter that is up to each of these communities.
